

Tunisian-Omani Co-operation in education field looked at



Omani Minister of Education Yahia Ibn Saoud Ibn Mansour Al-Sillimi stressed the privileged level of Tunisian-Omani co-operation in the education field.

He added, at a meeting on Tuesday with Education Minister Hatem Ben Salem, that his country has drawn on the Tunisian experiences and skills in this area.

The meeting was held on the sidelines of the 13th session of the Tunisian-Omani joint committee due on June 10-11, 2010 in Tunis.

The Omani minister voiced hope that the outcome of this session would be a new milestone in the process of bilateral co-operation.

He also stressed will to strengthen bilateral co-operation in the economic, trading and scientific fields, reviewing, in this regard, the promising indicators to boost co-operation in several sectors, including education, vocational training, higher education, investment, agriculture and communication technologies.

For his part, Mr. Hatem Ben Salem said that the 13th session of the Tunisian-Omani joint committee is an opportunity to identify ways to expand bilateral co-operation, to consolidate the fraternity relations and materialise the political will driving the two countries' leaders, President Zine el Abidine Ben Ali and Sultan Qabus Bin Said.

The minister emphasised the importance of increasing the volume of trade exchanges between the two countries. He praised the creation, to this effect, of the joint trade and investment committee which seeks to ease commodities marketing and investment flow.
