2010 Baccalaureate main session exam records 50.2 per cent success rate



Sixty seven thousand 520 students (all sections included) out of a total of 134 000 511 candidates were declared admitted at the main session of the 2010 Baccalaureate examination, thus representing a success rate of 50.2 per cent.

This rate is the highest since 2002 when was introduced the counting system of averages obtained during the school year into the overall average obtained by a given student.

During a news conference, Education Minister Hatem Ben Salem Saturday indicated that the "sports" section recorded the highest rate of success within the subject, with 422 laureates (88.28 pc), followed by the "maths" section with 9 thousand 956 laureates (66.16 pc).



16 thousand 375 students were admitted within the "experimental sciences" section, 7 thousand 264 in « computer science, » 12 thousand 687 in "economics and management," 5 thousand 877 in "technical sciences" and 14 thousand 939 in "Letters."

In public high schools the rate of success reached 57.24 pc and 17.49 pc in private establishments and 0.75 pc for independent examinees, stated the Minister.

With respect to high schools, 10 achieved a 100 pc rate of success and 33 achieved a rate equal or higher than 75 pc.

49 thousand 412 candidates will be taking the remedial session, say 36.73 pc.
